Class work

We aim to set work appropriate for pupils' individual needs wherever possible. Your child will be expected to work independently, with an adult or in group situations as appropriate to the task and their learning needs.

Reading homework

Your child will read regularly in school but we do expect every child to read for at least 20 minutes everyday at home and for their reading record to be signed by an adult. These books will be checked everyday and will be used by Mrs Hooper to add to your child's record of books for 'Book Trail'. Your child is responsible for changing his/her individual reading book and has the opportunity to do so every playtime in the KS2 library or from the books supplied in Upper Key Stage Two classrooms.

Mental maths homework

Please help your child to learn their times tables. We do 99 club every week so they can show off their skills and earn their badges.

Your child will also be given a mental maths workbook to be completed as directed by the class teacher each week. This will be marked and is expected to be handed in weekly.



<u>Homework</u>

We consider homework to be a very important part of the curriculum in Year 5/6. We hope that this will not only prepare your child for secondary school but also help to improve their reading and research skills.
